Via de Cristo, meaning "the Way of Christ," is a Lutheran Lay movement designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people and bring you to a new awareness of living in God's grace. This structured three-day weekend, is a combined effort of lay people and clergy, that strives to give you time apart with God and give you tools to help you on your spiritual journey and walk with Christ.

Via de Cristo is not a church and Christians of all denominations are welcome. We point Christians to Christ and encourage you to serve where you already are – your home church, your workplace and your community.

In today's world, can Christianity penetrate the many secular areas of life? Can it live there? Can it grow there? Can it transform the world? The Via de Cristo movement thinks so.

A Via de Cristo retreat starts on Thursday evening and ends late Sunday afternoon.

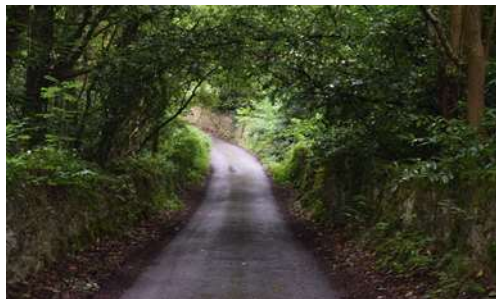


Where are weekends held?
