Tests showed nothing out of order, so they have been connected with a cardiologist for further testing. In the meantime, they are feeling terrific.

As I watched the activity I was awestruck how quickly and unexpectedly this gift of life can end. Secondly, it was the swift action of the right people who gave this person a new lease on life. What would have happened if any one who responded were not there that morning?

This is yet one way the church was being the church. Each person in this incident had a different gift and they used it to God's glory and the person is alive today because their gifts were used.

The church was truly the Body of Christ. When led by the Holy Spirit that community can bring back life.

When I was in seminary, I appreciated the fact every day just before lunch there was chapel. Chapel time gave me time to go off and finish some homework. But I started to notice one of my favorite professors went to chapel every day. Finally, I got up the courage to ask him why he was there every day. He told me that sometimes he needed a chance to worship with other people. At chapel they were there greeting, singing, praying, preaching the word, and sometimes sharing communion. Then there were other days he guessed his brother or sister might needed him.

Hearing that story, I started attending chapel a whole lot better. I believe that there is some advice for us in Via de Cristo. We need to get together for mutual support so that each of us might become better members of the body and more fulfilled in living.

I pray our renewal weekend at Agape, September 16-18 will provide that opportunity for our community to get started again after being shut down by Covid.

Please remember that we need to talk to God about our friend BEFORE we talk to our friend about God. Also remember that you have to wait for a reply!

It is vitally important that you stay in touch with the Guest well before the weekend, answer any questions honestly (while trying to keep a few surprises secret), and equally important is the follow up after the weekend. You will then be responsible for helping your new brother or sister to find a reunion group to be part of. Without a reunion group to support them, the weekend may well just turn in to a pleasant memory. Maybe you will even start a new group to help them get along. The point is that there is a lot that goes with sponsor- ship and it can be a totally rewarding experience for your brother or sister as well as you! So give the idea of sponsor ship some thought and help someone build a new relationship with Christ on Mixed #106!

Update from the Health and Welfare Task Force

A lot has changed since we last reported to you: weekends postponed, weekends added, Ultreyas conducted, new CDC guidelines and metrics. It's difficult to be current when we only publish monthly and perhaps meet every two months. But the good news is that things seem to be settling into a more predictable routine even if the COVID virus continues to thrive. Because of the success of vaccines and treatments, *if you are vaccinated and boosted* it is not as scary as it was this time last year. It is still a very real threat for serious illness for the unvaccinated, especially older adults.

So, based on all that, we have updated our expectations of participants on weekends, including the Renewal Weekend in September. We will not be requiring vaccination status, nor will we be doing daily temperature and symptom checks. *We have also eliminated the Participation Agreement and just ask that, if you are participating in a weekend event, you take reasonable precautions to avoid exposure to the virus ahead of the weekend, and that you ARRIVE HEALTHY.*
