As I look back at the blessings of the past 22 years, the one piece of the puzzle that continues to grow and touch me is the community. This shared experience and agape love that binds us like a family is alive and growing. Those connections are started with the people at our table as guests. From there it grows and grows. Every time you serve together or show up for an event the bonds get bigger and stronger. This Christian community is the foundation that keeps us together. This community is a requirement to keep this wonderful gift of the VDC thriving. This community is alive, healthy, and starting again to grow. Last September we had our first event in almost three years at Agape. 38 of us met for Renewal Weekend #4. We were blessed with a wonderful serenade of 4 people. As small as it was, it was also a shining example of community and God's unwavering hand in our lives. It was Chuck Wolfe's last VDC activity. It was also a wake-up to how much COVID had impacted us. When Jim Bailey was called as Rector for M#106, we had big concerns about getting a team together. In my rollo at RW#4 I said our active community was 50-60 people. Two years earlier we had over 100 people at the serenade for M#105. COVID had hit VDC and our churches really hard. Would Jim be able to assemble a team? If he did, would guests want to come? Jim said yes and M#106 was added to our prayer lists. Jim and Linda Evans did a lot of heavy lifting to assemble their team. That meant picking up the phone and calling past team members within the community. Some people just needed a little push. Others just needed to be asked to support the community and they jumped on board. At one Secretariat meeting they had 16 team members. Two weeks later they had 38. The same thing happened with sponsors and guests. Our worries were wasted energy. God had it under control. One of the scariest things to say yes to is being a serenade leader. You pick music, call your pals, and hope you not are walking into the dining room alone. Diane Colin and Lynn Hess say yes. Again, God showed up. 50+ people walked into the dining room on Saturday night. It was such a gift. In the six months since RW#4, our active community has more than doubled. Bonnie Clinton is the Rectora for M#107 (14-17Sept). When we talked last week she said she might have to turn down team applications if the current rate of applications continues. That is hard to comprehend that our community has become this active since RW#4 in September. The Holy Spirit is at work and we are blessed. At the Secretariat retreat in January, I asked the following question, "Do we have enough support to hold two weekends in 2024". The answer was an overwhelming yes. I had my doubts. Based on the past few weeks, I was wrong.

Last year the Nominating Committee was me. I spent several months was unable to fill all of our open positions. This year Lynne Hoffman volunteered to head the Nominating Committee. Kris Sloman and Lindsey Daugherty joined Lynne on this project. In less than a month they had filled all six of our open positions. Four those who have volunteered to serve are new to Secretariat. This is another joyful sign of God answer prayers. Big thanks to the committee.

There is a great deal of energy within our community. I am in awe of all that is happening. Ultreyas and reunion groups are critical in our 4th day. These two key components of the VDC keep us accountable and connected. I encourage each of you to support the Secretariat efforts to re-start Ultreyas in the Triangle, Triad, and Charlotte areas. The beach group has a system that is working. I can't say everyone attends every event, but our numbers keep growing. I would also encourage you to look for Ultreyas outside your local area and attend. If the drive is too far, call a member of the community and spend the night. Be intentional! Reconnect with that team member or table mate from a past weekend. We have currently called the Rector for M#108 in February 2024. Mixed #109 is scheduled for the September 2024. Before COVID we were successfully having three weekends a year? Do we need to think about a third weekend in 2024? Do we need three weekends in 2025? Those answers are tied to the community. If we are filling teams and turning people down, then we need to add another weekend. That is a problem I look forward to having. The Via de Cristo is about building and equipping Christian leaders. We love weekends, serenades, Ultreyas, and reunion groups. Being together impacts us in ways we never expected. With all that we have to celebrate, remember we can't stay on the mountaintop. We are called to go back to our local church and community to be Christ's hands and feet. I pray your Lenten journey is a time to reflect as we anticipate the joy of Easter. I hope to see you at the M#106 Babe Chick Ultreya on March 18. The Ultreya is at St. Paul's in Wilmington at 11:30. If you are there, you might have a surprise or two (don't anticipate).

Secretariat meetings are open to anyone in the community, except when we are in executive session. Executive session only happens when we are voting on future rectors and dealing with personnel matters.
